I suffer from limited mobility due to neurofibromatosis type 1. The severity of my case was underestimated. By grade 4, I suffered from severe scoliosis and kyphosis due to the growth of a very large benign tumor next to my spine. My back had 90-degree curvature, and it was collapsing my lungs, and one side of my rib cage was as thin as pencils. Physical activity was painful, and once the doctors finally organized themselves, it was addressed.

As an elementary student, I was unperturbed by my future. My few concerns involved friends and family. When the doctors announced I would have to spend two months in the hospital with a medical halo screwed into my head that would be tied to weights that would be constantly increased in the hope that the pressure would be enough to straighten my spine, I was in shock. My parents thought I would have to redo grade 5. I detested the idea of redoing a year of school because it meant I had given up easily. For the longest, I can remember my NF1 condition has always taken some hold over my life. My education was the one thing I did have power over. NF1 may have taken over my body forever controlling my physical capabilities, but it had not yet been powerful enough to affect my mental capacities. I would not let it affect something I had the power to control.

It was that year I got a passion for biomedical engineering. During the months I spent in the hospital I saw several kids suffering from conditions similar to and different from my own. There was a girl only a few years younger than me who had gone through several surgeries to correct her scoliosis due to NF1 only to suffer from infection and paralysis. She so far has had no success in her treatment and was continuously suffering from complications. She was suffering mentally, and physically due to her NF1 and was helpless to do anything about it. With the limited treatments for NF1 patients, there was not much that could be done for her, and I doubt if she was able to survive. As a biomedical engineer, and someday, as a doctor, I intend to create better mechanisms to ensure successful surgeries in not only NF1 patients but also scoliosis patients in general. If I get my master's I would like to study neurofibromatosis and figure out how to make equipment that leads to more successful surgeries in neurofibromatosis patients.

After a month of recovery from my first major spinal surgery that fused my lower back to the top of my back, I returned to school extremely behind, only the next year to have to return for two other surgeries completely fusing the lower of my back to the top of my neck. My value for my education became stronger than before. I worked every night after school during my academic year, doing extra reviews in my textbook. Despite my fast growing academic success I still faced challenges in the classroom such as I could no longer bend my neck in order to write on a flat surface. I adapted by bringing a portable music easel to each one of my class, and used stool suction cups to keep the easel from sliding off the table. It impacted the speed I could write on tests. I studied twice as hard so I could match my classmates' speed through knowledge to make up for my inability to write as quickly. I wrote within the time frame that was offered in class without supplementary time. It took ingenuity to adapt, but I was up to the challenge.

By grade 12 graduation, I had gotten the highest grade in my Calculus class with a final average of 100%, and a school awarded mark of 98% in my Pre-Calculus 30-1 class. I excelled in my English Language Arts 30-1 class, getting the highest grade in my English class two years in a row. It was education and perseverance that helped distract me from the physical pain that I endured and overcome my disability. As a biomedical engineer, I strive to aid the disabled community.

We are writing about your daughter Asha Khodarahmi-Brom's eligibility for the disability tax credit (DTC).


