I am excited to have the opportunity to apply for this scholarship as I enter the Masters of Clinical Social Work through the University of Calgary (UofC) that started on May 2nd of this year. My past educational involvement starts in 2005 when I was accepted into the Addictions Counselling Diploma through the Medicine Hat College. After two years students in this faculty have a choice to finish with the diploma or continue onto the University of Lethbridge to complete at Bachelors of Health Sciences with a major in Mental Health and Addictions Counselling. I chose to complete my degree and convocation in May 2009. After working 6 years for the Saskatchewan Health Region as a Mental Health and Addictions Counsellor I started my family. My partner and I had 4 sons who now range in age from 10 years old down to 3 years old. We moved to Alberta 2 years ago to support a change in my husbands job. With this move I had the opportunity to work for the Red Deer Polytechnic and was the successful applicant for the 2020-2021 school year. I worked in the Counselling Services department under Student Services. This recent and my past work experience ignited a drive in me to one day complete a Masters Degree. Needless to say I was ecstatic when I found out I was accepted into the UofC. This Masters will take 3 years to complete with two practicums.

The program I am taking specializes in both Trauma as well as the clinical components of Social Work. This means I will be working closely with the Diagnostic Statistics Manual as well as Therapies that are Best Practice for assessing and treating many learning disabilities as well as mental health and addictions issues. The program's entire focus is on helping people and supporting them through what causes them distress, discomfort or makes functioning hard to manage.

Along with my program focussing on clinical counselling, I have also very recently been diagnosed with ADHD. This allows for a deeper empathy when it comes to working with those who also wonder or have been diagnosed as well as speaks to the resilience I have had throughout the many years of work and education with this learning disability. I am passionate about this line of work and helping others to manage and hopefully not have to struggle any longer than they already have through mental health or learning disability challenges.

Due to being new to the student life once again, I don't have any examples of contributions to campus life however, can speak to my involvement and volunteering in my community. Prior to Covid I was a leader of two different parent groups. One parent group focussed on mothers and help set mothers up with mentorship, health professionals as well as peer support. The second group was a community drop in group for parents or caretakers of preschoolers. This group focussed on being a drop in so that children could meet and play while their caretakers could visit and get peer support. I helped run those programs for over 4 years as I took a step back from work and stayed home to raise my young sons. Currently I am connected and volunteering at another mothers group where I am doing group presentations on communication and mental health.

In the future as I progress through this Masters my hope is to take part in the mentorship program the UofC is piloting and perhaps in my last year connect to a first year student in order to help them navigate the many aspects of being a student.

Once again, I am so thankful and excited to be starting this education and to have the opportunity to apply for this scholarship in order to help with the financial stress of being a mature student, who is raising young children and introducing full time studies into the mix.





This letter is in regard to Chelsea Westrom (D.O.B. February 12, 1985). I am a Registered Psychologist in the province of Alberta who has worked with Chelsea. Chelsea sought services to determine if she has Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). The Conners' Adult ADHD Rating Scales (CAARS) was administered to Chelsea and an observer (Chelsea's partner). Based on the results from the CAARS assessment and my clinic interview, it is my clinical opinion that Chelsea meets the criteria for:

• 314.01 - Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder - Predominantly hyperactive/impulsive presentation - Moderate (F90.1)

Chelsea's symptoms manifested in early childhood and currently impact her at home and school.

Chelsea endorsed symptoms of inattention; however, her symptoms were insufficient to meet criteria for diagnosis of inattentive presentation and/or combined presentation. Nevertheless, her inattentive symptoms do interfere with how she functions at home and school.

It is my recommendation that Chelsea speak with her family physician and discuss medical options related to ADHD treatment. Chelsea would also benefit from continuing to implement behavioral strategies at home and at school to help manage her ADHD.
