Reason for Referral:

According to initial discussion with Isabelle's mother, Isabelle has a history of difficulties with basic word reading and spelling, which appears to be associated with her weakness in making sound/symbol associations. Her mother indicated that there is a history of dyslexia within the family and she feels that the difficulties that Isabelle has displayed are consistent with the struggles experienced by other family members. Isabelle was home-schooled for all of her elementary school years (i.e., Kindergarten through Grade 8) but attended Notre Dame Catholic High School for Grade 9. She then chose to return to home-schooling for her Grade 10 year. At the time of the current assessment, Isabelle was attempting to decide whether to return to Notre Dame CHS for Grade 11, or continue with home-schooling. Her goal is to continue on to university when she is finished Grade 12.

To help support her remaining time in high school, and also help to ensure that she receives the supports needed to be successful when she attends post-secondary studies, her parents felt that a psychological assessment would be advantageous. More specifically, her parents asked that the current assessment attempt to determine whether Isabelle does have a Learning Disability (i.e., dyslexia) that is negatively impacting her reading and spelling skills, and if so, provide programming suggestions that will help Isabelle reach her true potential as a learner.

Background Information:

Background information was gathered through the completion of the BASC-3 Structured Developmental History questionnaire by Isabelle's mother.

Isabelle's family includes her mother, father and three sisters (i.e., aged 20, 18, and 11 years). Isabelle's oldest sister lives with the family during the summer months, and her youngest sister joined the family
