When choosing this program, I had to consider how my classes would affect my ability to cope. Since I'll have to manage both, I believe that it will motivate me to go into my first year and succeed.

My disability entails that I struggle to find motivation when doing something I'm uninterested in. Since I was in 7th grade, I knew that being a forensic pathologist was my dream job. My mother and I would always watch forensic files, and through that, I learned it was my calling. The stories I heard on tv depicting families of victims who found peace after autopsies were performed, encouraged me to pursue this career. I recognize that as much as those who have been murdered are victims, their family and friends are a victim of the circumstance too. I want to be a part of their healing process whether directly or indirectly. I believe that if I can help even one person find peace after a horrendous crime, all of the work and dedication put into schooling will be worth it. My passion for the field and program I'm going into will motivate me to strive and do well.

When applying, I put into consideration what average was needed to get in. The average needed to get in was 75 percent to 80 percent and I exceeded that, having a graduating highschool average of 91.77 percent. There were times where I doubted my ability to learn and cope with the academic pressures placed on me, but sought help to overcome my issues. Throughout highschool I was able to seek guidance from a teacher who has the same disability as me. She taught me different techniques to manage my time, such as the pomodoro method. I have consistently worked hard for my marks, as continual improvement is very important to me. I have tried innumerable different study techniques, and will continue to do so to prepare for university. Going forward I'm not going to let my disability hinder my ability to succeed.

Furthermore, I've spoken to one of the professors who is teaching the forensics lecture and does some of the senior classes. She explained that as you go into your 3rd and 4th year specializations, the classes get smaller. I also put this into consideration as smaller classes will allow for more structure and direct support from professors.

I'm grateful for the opportunity to apply for this scholarship as I transition to the next phase of my life. In university I plan to continue to seek out help from teachers and resources they have for students. I know that my disability will be an ongoing challenge, but I hope to continue to be resilient in my personal and academic growth. I'm joining a program that I'm passionate about and am committed to becoming a forensic pathologist.
