Live audaciously. Those were the words of Celina Caeser-Chavannes a former member of parliament who I had the opportunity to meet. She was one of many presenters that I've met through Leadership by Design. A group focused on empowering young Black students by fostering community, enhancing leadership skills, and providing academic support through workshops, seminars, and mentorship. Through this program, I have improved my leadership abilities and demonstrated a commitment to personal and collective growth within my community. For some reason, the words "live audaciously" stuck with me the first time Celina said them and the more she said those words, the more I considered how I want to lead that kind of life. Throughout the presentation, I counted the phrase "live audaciously" six times, but Celina never explicitly defined the phrase. In my opinion, an audacious life is one filled with courage, resilience, and the readiness to pursue my passion despite adversity. Furthermore, it is the ability to help others realize their own potential and live their lives without fear of rejection or failure.

For the past 2 years, I have had the privilege of tutoring a student named Ayman for math. It is rewarding to see how my efforts have improved Ayman's academics. Demonstrating that we can all have an impact in someone's life, big or small. I believe that in the time that I've known Ayman, I have taught him to live audaciously and be successful in all that he does, regardless of his setbacks. I am grateful for all of my experiences and the people I've met through my work as a tutor, canvasser and foodbank volunteer because they reinforced the idea, that I want my life to serve my community. These ideas for my future were solidified in 2022 when I was diagnosed with Chron's Disease (IBD). I've never personally known someone who has a chronic illness or disability, so experiencing it myself has given me a new perspective. This diagnosis taught me that I can overcome the worst of circumstances and achieve my goals despite having every excuse not to. I learned that my life is not over because I have a disability, but rather, it has just begun. I now have the opportunity to teach others about a disability that is so often overlooked and dedicate my passion for science to being a voice for those with the illness. On social media, academically or through face-to-face conversations.

I've decided to study human kinetics with the goal that I will become a healthcare professional who can help those who are in a similar situation to me and be like the doctors and nurses who give me comfort. Whether that be in the form of a geneticist to understand the genetic factors that affect the disease, a gastroenterologist to help individuals live with their diagnosis or even a scientist who can one day invent a medicine that can better treat IBD. Although IBD is less prevalent among the black community, it does occur with a higher rate of morbidity and unnoticed symptoms. This is completely unnecessary considering that IBD is a treatable illness and can be improved with the right education and understanding of the disability. I had never heard about IBD before my diagnosis. Perhaps, if it had been discussed more in my community, my family and I would have noticed the very telling symptoms that I was experiencing. Maybe we would have taken better action before my condition worsened to the point of weighing 76 pounds, having a hemoglobin (blood) count of 46, which is a count that many nurses said was the lowest they had ever seen and missing two months of school.

I wish to pursue a career in STEM so that I can eventually be in a position where I can educate individuals on a larger scale and be a part of the solution for an illness that is not heavily researched. So that the experience of others who have IBD will not mirror the daily debilitating experiences that I've had with the disability. This scholarship would help me reach these goals because it would offset some of the costs associated with going to med school, therefore allowing me to focus on my studies and advocate for those around me. Although these goals may sound ambitious, because I have adopted to phrase "live audaciously", I have every confidence that I will be able to achieve them all. If you haven't noticed while reading, I've said the phrase "live audaciously" six times, like Celina did, and, I'm going to say it one more time. So that someone reading this essay can be inspired by these words just like I was. Live audaciously.




