These conditions should be taken into consideration when assessing her level of disability. I hope you find this letter useful in your assessment of Ms. Clark.





#### Dear, Disability Credit Canada

A brief background on what my home life looked like. My family moved around often due to my dad's work and was not financially stable. I found myself struggling with the hardships with my family life and it was in school that it showed the most. I had a tough time keeping up with schoolwork. When I was young, I got diagnosed with Auditory Processing Disorder and ADHD. It was difficult for me as I did not fully understand my mental health problems.

I became a single parent when I had my son at 20 years old. I moved into Villa Rosa, an organization that helps young single mothers. That is when I found my motivation to go back to school. I attended parenting courses and some high school classes while living there. My oldest son has Autism and ADHD. I really did not have a clue as to how to help my son and his feelings of being misunderstood with special needs and having my own as well.

In my life, I have taken courses like the specialized training course called Paving the Way at Taking Charge, an organization to help single parents. While there I took self-improvement classes, got computer training, and obtained certificates in Intro to Windows, Internet, Microsoft Office, and Advanced Microsoft Word.

I also spent some time doing volunteer work at Siloam Mission, which is a homeless shelter and food bank. I would either help organize clothes in the donation room or in the kitchen with preparing and serving food to the homeless. In addition, I assisted with cleaning up the area in the dining room. I also volunteered at church with my mom. Helping with donations there as well and giving out food to those in need.

I received certificates from the Manitoba Tourism Education Council for Handling Difficult Situations, Workplace Essentials, and Manitoba BEST Service Excellence.

Helen Betty Osborne story is one that has impacted me tremendously because I can relate to her story. I had an aunty who was a victim. At 15 years old her life way taken away by a drink driver, and due to the failed justice system, nothing was done about it. My mom is a residential school survivor, and with the death of her sister caused a lot of generational traumas that also impacted me growing up. I want to stop the generational pain and it ends with me. Moving forward in life by going to university has always been a dream of mine.

Being a young Metis woman of 2 kids. Having my youngest son in 2016. I became a single mom once again and got out of a physically and mentally abusive relationship before my son was born. I know I must work just that much harder to be the successful person I know I can be. Going back to school I was able to achieve my goals of receiving my Mature Student Diploma at Winnipeg Adult Education Centre and my success at WAEC encouraged me to further my education taking Psychology, Sociology, and Indigenous Studies at the University of Winnipeg. My goal is to get a career helping the Indigenous community that are faced with mental disabilities. Growing up being Métis, it was difficult finding someone in the healthcare field that had cultural understanding. This made it difficult to relate to the professional. I did not feel comfortable being honest to get my need fully met by healthcare professionals. There needs to

be more trained healthcare people that have the cultural background or understanding to ensure Indigenous are getting their issues taking care of and therefore why I am looking to find a career in the healthcare field that help those with mental disabilities.

Being the first in my family to go into university. This bursary means everything to me by allowing me not to go into debt in my pursue for a better life. I want to stop the generational poverty with me showing my kids the importance of education. The Disabilities Canada Credit award will help ensure me by getting one more step closer to giving my boys and family a more stable home environment that I never had and gain financial independents I need.
