How Cerebral Palsy Has Shaped My Career Choices

Living with Cerebral Palsy has never been easy. It has shaped my life drastically, whether it be with school, peer groups, or even just my own self esteem. The way my body works has affected me in ways that many able-bodied people would not be able to begin to imagine. Most importantly, however, coming to terms with my condition has shaped my future career choices. Once I was a kid with wild fantasies of being a veterinary surgeon, thinking that I could be the Dr. House of the animal world. Now, I realise my true passion lies in something that is not as physically and mentally stressful on my different body, yet still helps the people of my country. I want to be a forensic psychologist.

Now, it may not be clear at first how Cerebral Palsy influenced the study of the mind. But it is actually quite simple. As a veterinarian I would have to be on my feet for much longer periods of time than I can physically manage without being in pain. I would also be at a great disadvantage due to the lack of fine motor skills in my left side, and partial blindness in my left eye. But, where my physical skills are lacking, my cognitive skills flourish. Being someone who isn't very mobile, I learned very quickly in my high school career that I absolutely thrive doing analysis and assessment based work. That is when I fell in love with psychology. You see, I have always been fascinated by the brain; after all, damage to my cerebral motor cortex when I was a fetus is what caused my disability in the first place. But, learning the biology aspect proved to be not as engaging as I expected it to be; so then I turned to behaviour.

The Forensic aspect is the only thing that does not tie to my disability. General psychology is interesting and seems like a more adequete topic to preserve my mental and physical conditions from being ruined by long, painful and tedious ours that wear on my already weak leg and hands. But, I have always found comfort in watching crime investigation shows after hard days when I am sore and tired. After finding a field of psychology that fascinates me and provides better accommodations for my

disability that ensures there is not much physical labour that could harm me, It was much easier to have a plan going forward into my future.

Many people think that the change in career paths is because I had given up due to my Cerebral Palsy. In reality, coming to terms with my disability and realising that I would not be happy in a job that causes me to be in physical pain at the end of every day has caused me to find a new passion. This passion not only gives me a career path that is interesting to me, it helps my country by protecting it from people who could potentially be a security threat or public danger. Analysing people in an office or in interrogation would accommodate my physical needs more, and would not cause more chronic pain than what I already experience.

Psychology as a whole has also already proven to give me better coping strategies to handle the stress caused by my cerebral palsy and the harmful comments made by peers, and I believe that this scholarship will help me pursue a degree that not just helps me analyse the mental health of others, but also analyse my own mental wellbeing and improve it. Overall, I believe that cerebral palsy has given me a goal that will make me happy and feel like I have been successful in life, because I have come to terms with and learned how to deal with my disability effectively. Cerebral Palsy made my day-to-day life different, but not all of its side effects are negative.

Brock Scholars Award - Eligibility Requirements

Determining the value of your Brock Scholars Award:

The Brock Scholars Award is offered on the basis of your admission average. The minimum average to be eligible for this program is 80.0%*. Brock calculates your admission average to the nearest 10th of a percent. We do not round averages up or down. *The award value is subject to approval by the Board of Trustees and is only applicable for the Offer of Admission enclosed.

The final value of your award may increase or decrease if your FINAL admission average changes. To remain eligible for the scholarship amount you have been offered, you must achieve the minimum FINAL admission average for that scholarship range. If there is any change in the amount you are to receive, you will be notified as to the final amount of your scholarship. If your final admission average is less than $80.0\%^{**}$ you will no longer be eligible for a Brock Scholars award. **U.S. applicants please refer to brocku.ca/admissions/international/united-states-curriculum/ for clarification.

Final Admission Average:

In Ontario, a student's final admission average is determined using the top 6 grade 12U or 12M credits (including prerequisites). If you complete a non-Ontario curriculum, the final admission average criteria will vary by curriculum, and will be determined by the Admissions Office. Courses taken in the summer following graduation will be considered for scholarship revisions, but official transcripts will only be accepted until October 31.

Scholarship Disbursement:

Your scholarship will be applied directly to your tuition and/or residence fees. This will take place before classes begin, reducing the amount you owe to the University. If you are commencing full time studies in the Spring or Winter sessions, you will receive one half of your full scholarship value before classes begin. The remainder of your scholarship will be credited to your student account before classes begin in the subsequent session.

Brock Course Load Requirements:

To receive the first installment of your scholarship, you must be a full-time student. If you reduce your course load to part-time status (less than 3.0 credits in the fall/winter) or withdraw from the University, the value of your scholarship will be pro-rated or withdrawn. Please advise the Student Accounts and Financial Aid Office of any change in your registration status - preferably before a change is actually made in order to assess the financial implications.

Scholarship Renewal:

Renewals will be based upon completion of each 5.0 credit milestone. An 80.0% average is required to renew. Renewal eligibility is assessed upon completion of each 5.0 credit milestone, regardless of whether or not the scholarship was renewed the previous year.

Students pursuing a pass degree (3 years of study) are eligible for a total of 2 consecutive renewals; students pursuing an honours degree (4 years of study) are eligible for a total of 3 consecutive renewals.

Students pursuing the Concurrent Education program are only eligible for scholarship renewals during the completion of their first undergraduate degree and will not receive a scholarship renewal in their final two years of Teachers Education.

For courses completed while on exchange, or any course that does not have a numeric value (eg. nursing clinical or Co-op work terms) students must contact central@brocku.ca for renewal review. Co-op work term courses are excluded from renewal milestones. Other credit courses that do not have a numeric grade are used to determine the renewal milestones but do not affect the milestone academic average. Renewal averages are calculated using courses that have numeric grades within the milestone. If there are no numeric grades in the milestone, the grades from the previous milestone will be used.

Scholarship Acceptance:

To confirm your scholarship acceptance and receive your scholarship you must reply to your Offer of Admission by the deadline indicated. Recipients agree to permit the release of their name, program, and year of study.

We are writing about your daughter Alexis Stanbrook-McIntyre's eligibility for the disability tax credit (DTC).

We have completed our review and determined that Alexis is eligible for the DTC for 2007 and future years. You may be entitled to claim the disability amount on your income tax and benefit returns for these years.

Please do not send us another Form T2201, "Disability Tax Credit Certificate," unless we ask for one.

Since you are claiming the disability amount for a dependant, you must inform us if he/she is no longer residing with you, or if you are no longer supporting his // are no longer supporting him/her in one or more of the basic necessities of life (e.g., food, shelter, or clothing).

Note: Support that does not relate to providing the necessities of life, such as visiting the dependant each day, providing moral support, preparing a meal, doing the person's laundry, and/or shopping, does not entitle an individual to request the transfer.

If anyone claims medical expenses for full-time care in a nursing home for a person with a disability, OR claims attendant care of more than \$10,000 for that person, no one may claim the disability amount for that person. A claim can be made for either these medical expenses or the disability amount, whichever is more beneficial.

If you want us to adjust a tax year to allow a claim for the disability amount, please send us a completed Form T1-ADJ, "T1 Adjustment Request," or a letter with the details of your request to the attention of the Disability Tax Credit team at the tax centre that serves your area. After we receive the request, we will consider an adjustment for the years requested.

Please note the disability amount is a non-refundable tax credit that reduces the amount of tax you owe. If the total of the credit is more than the amount you owe, no refund is issued for the difference.

If a representative is acting for you, you must provide us with a signed letter or a completed Form T1013, "Authorizing or Cancelling a Representative," authorizing the representative to make this request.

Families with a child who meets the criteria for the DTC, may be entitled to receive an amount under the child disability benefit (CDB), which is a supplement to the Canada child tax benefit (CCTB).

Your dependant's eligibility for the DTC may entitle the person who is eligible for the CCTB for this dependant to receive the CDB.

If the person is entitled, the CDB will be included in the CCTB payments.

If you would like the CDB for the 2007 to 2012 tax years, please send a written request for the CDB to the attention of the CCTB entitlement team at the tax centre that serves your area.

If you need more information about the Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP), please see the attached RDSP information sheet.

If you have questions about our decision, contact our Individual income tax enquiries service at 1-800-959-8281. If you use a teletypewriter (TTY), contact our bilingual TTY enquiry service at 1-800-665-0354 during regular working hours.
