Life with my Partner, BPD

Since grade eight I have struggled with my mental health. I had no idea what was going on, my social worker had no idea what was going on and when I finally got into my psychiatrist she had no idea either. Until this year I had yet to learn that I had been living with Borderline Personality Disorder. When we finally sorted it out it made sense that it fit with me. Although it fits with me, Borderline Personality Disorder is not fixed with a pill. Medication and Dialectical Behavioural Therapy is the combination that works for it and it is a very strenuous path.

Having such a hard time with my mental health made me appreciate the people who go through life with few mental health crises and all the people who have to deal with me. So when I finally picked my career path I decided to go medical, and in going medical I decided to go into neuroscience to further discover the brain and how it functions.

Living with Borderline Personality Disorder and being hard of hearing has really pushed me to try and help other people who are struggling just like me. I know what it feels like to be alone and this way I can help people in a way that I understand what they are going through. It can be hard talking with someone who does not really understand what you are talking about.

I am taking a Bachelor of Science at Dalhousie University, majoring in neuroscience. From there I plan on becoming a physiatrist or a neurosurgeon, either way having the skills to help people. The body is an amazing thing however sometimes it does things that we do not understand. The important thing is to find ways to solve these issues that happen.

I've learned that people with Borderline Personality Disorder act with emotion because that is often what is controlling them. I can relate to this as well as some of my future patients who are having difficulty with friends and family because of it.

My sister lost her hearing in one of her ears when I was in grade 9. It was so sudden and her ears were perfect so they did not know why or how she had lost it. They took her in for an MRI because they were worried about a tumor in her brain that might be stopping her from being able to hear out of that ear. Her MRI was clear but I still remember how I could not believe that something in your brain could cut off your hearing in one ear. Even though that wasn't the cause of her hearing loss I still think about all the people that this happens to. Being a good neurosurgeon I can operate on that person and give them back their hearing.

Living with what I have, Borderline Personality Disorder and hearing loss, it makes me want to help others. No one should be stuck alone with their struggles, everyone should have someone to talk to. I want to be that someone who can help out and be there to help someone fix their problems. When we are united together we can do anything.
